Dear Friends of All Nations,

Every organization espouses a mission, but to fulfill our vision, we need pathfinders to "explore untraversed regions to mark out a new route" (Merriam-Webster). **Pathfinders risk. They explore. They scout frontiers and mark out uncharted routes.** All Nations has formed 8 pathfinding teams to advance each of All Nations' 8 Key Global Priorities (see below) towards fulfilling our mission to make disciples and train leaders to ignite church planting movements among the neglected peoples of the earth!

Each team is multicultural and led by emerging leaders from various parts of the world. For example, one of our 8 Key Global Priorities is to Mobilize and Engage (ME) unreached people groups. So last month, a leader from the ME group was part of a scouting team to explore possible work among the persecuted Muslim Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh and to bring recommendations back to All Nations leadership! This ME group has also adopted the unreached Padhar group that All Nations is now working with (see video and infographics below). **Our motive is that like the apostle Paul, there is no place left that has not heard of Jesus (Romans 15:23).** Join us in praying that there is no place left for the Gospel to be preached.


Over the next eight months, All Nations will introduce each of our 8 Key Global Priorities and the innovative initiatives that each pathfinding team is blazing!

One of our global priorities, *Mobilize & Engage*, aims to cast vision and mobilize prayer and workers for specific unengaged and unreached people groups (UUPGs). These are groups He has highlighted for All Nations to focus on for a given period of time. They are chosen based on prayer, research, and opportunity.

One of the groups is the **Padhar of India**. Training Leaders To Ignite Church Planting Movements Pam Arlund

All believers are meant to be leaders. I know this is true because of *2 Timothy 2:2* and *Ephesians 4*. If the saints are supposed to do the works of service, then they are supposed to be leaders.

The most important leaders in church planting movements are the ones who lead one or two people or who lead a small church. If they don't do their job, then the movement doesn't happen. **Sometimes the coordinator of a movement can fail to do their job and the movement can still happen, but if the local disciple maker is not making disciples, then movements never happen.** So, the leaders of the few are some of the most important and most overlooked of all leaders.

I've noticed something about monkish traditions of leadership. Basically, in those traditions you are never considered ready for leadership if you are asking for leadership. This is a sign of immaturity. It shows that the person is looking for their ego to be fulfilled in leadership. Ego driven leaders are the most dangerous people on planet earth. In those monkish traditions, you are ready to lead when you don't care whether you lead. As I've grown older, I have seen more and more the wisdom of this.

Training makes me think of basic training in the military or training in a sport.

In both types of training there are a few basic skills that the person being trained practices over and over again. To be successful, the person being trained has to be able to carry out those skills without their coach present. Even in job training done in the corporate world, the trainer is not successful until the trainee can do the job without them. (Cf. Luke 6:40) **It's hard to realize that I have successfully trained a leader when I am not needed anymore, but that's always the goal.**
